Spotlight Marijuana Use Among Young People Hits Alarming All-Time High According to a <u>new report</u>, the number of young adults using marijuana is at the highest level ever recorded. The 2021 Monitoring the Future report reveals that more American youth are smoking and vaping pot than ever before. Surprisingly, this increase is happening while the use of most other substances is significantly decreasing. Because of the profound effect the drug has on still-developing adolescent and young adult brains, this alarming trend could have a severely negative impact on the health of future generations. "The science and data are all there. For example, here in Colorado marijuana is the most prevalent substance found in completed teen suicide," said Finn adding that just before and after the legalization of marijuana in Colorado, there was a spike in teens going to the emergency room. I have families calling me every day in a crisis, 'my teen, my child, my young adult is addicted to marijuana. It's making them psychotic, they're sick, they're vomiting, and they're arguing with me that it's natural, that's it's medicine, and we don't know what to do," said Aubree Adams, Director of Every Brain Matters, a non profit organization in Colorado that claims to offer community support based on science and lived experiences in response to the expanding drug culture in developing minds. By 2019, that figure had skyrocketed nearly 3200%, when 12,167 seniors made trips to emergency rooms for that reason. Learn More A Moment of Science 2022, December Monitoring the Future Survey - Marijuana - Amid 8th grade responders, marijuana was the top substance used. Overall, its use decreased from 2021 to 2022, however for 8th, 10th, and 12th graders who live in medical marijuana approved states, there was an increase in marijuana use and a decrease in disapproval and risk beliefs towards the drug. Furthermore, 6 % of 8th graders, 15 % of 10th graders, and 20.6 % of 12th graders reported vaping marijuana within the past year. 2022 December 16 - Drug Overdose Deaths Among Persons Aged 10-19 Years — United States, July 2019-December 2021, - From 2019 to 2020, there was a 94% increase in overdose deaths among teens ages 14 to 18 and from 2020 to 2021, a 20% increase in overdose deaths occurred. from July 2019 to December 2021 found that 84% of these deaths involved the very powerful drug fentanyl and a very low number of these youth had previous (11%) or current (3%) substance use disorder treatment experience or had documented opioid use history (35%). These findings along with the observation that less than 8% had documentation of injection and almost a quarter of overdose deaths were related to counterfeit pills (which is likely underreported), strongly suggest that overdose deaths in youth are not being driven by riskier use and emphasizes the urgency to prevent any substance use by youth. Other striking findings indicated that the majority of overdose deaths (60%) occurred at the youth's home and 41% had documented mental health history. Here is a breakdown of the trends and characteristics discovered... 2023 January 2 - Risk of depressive disorders associated with medical cannabis authorization: a propensity score matched cohort study - Our study showed that patients with medical cannabis authorization have a higher risk of emergency department visits or hospitalizations for depression compared to patients with no authorization. Our results also suggest that this risk is increased among patients without prior mental health disorders at cannabis authorization.
